- Paint


This is my last treasured moments report. ***I would like to introduce our new treasurer, Landon Elhard.*** He has a heart for camp ministry as

### Staff Profile- *Scott Rosom*



I have not met a lot of you, but we are linked by a common goal that Christ gives us in our lives. My name is Scott Rosom, I am twenty seven years old, I have

been doing camp ministry for 11 years, and I have greatly enjoyed every minute of it. I spent the better part of my summer at Fisher Bay Bible Camp, in the positions of councilor, and lifeguard. It is here that God revealed to me his plan, and the beginning of the amazing journey that lay ahead of me.

The summer started like any other, working with the kids, running skills, presenting the Gospel. However, as the third week began I started to feel God speaking to me in a way that I had never felt before. By the end of the third week I was sure that I was not supposed to be in Regina this year, although I did not know where this was leading, I continued to be sensitive to the Spirit. I was the speaker for the fourth week at camp, which I had never done before but had felt drawn to try. It went well, and as the weeks went on God began to reveal many of my strengths. A new view of my abilities was beginning to emerge, and His plan was beginning to unravel.

I was not sure where God was leading me, which was beginning to make me nervous because I was not sure what I was supposed to do after camp. As the final week was drawing to a close I was having a

conversation with Kevin, the Pastor of the Riverbend Bible Church in Dallas. He was saying how much he wished he could start a youth group but he did not have the necessary volunteers. Not thinking much of the conversation, I went to bed and woke up with a start, with the conversation on my mind. God made it clear that this was the journey He had planned for me. I could not believe it. I felt completely ill prepared to take on the role of a youth leader. I met with Kevin anyway and told him about the possibilities during which time Kevin said a phrase that I will always remember. He said "God does not always call the prepared, sometimes he prepares the called". With that I left and went back to Regina.

Two and a half weeks later, I quit my job, left my family and friends, picked up my life, and moved to Fisher River. I had no place to stay, no job, just the feeling that this is what I was supposed to do. On the way there God provided me with a house to stay in, and all I have to pay is the electric bill and by Sunday I had secured a job. However, a new opportunity has arisen and I am currently raising money to become a missionary with an organization called Healing Hearts. This will allow me to continue doing camp follow-up with the kids as well as learn to become more effective in my ministry, as I will be doing an extensive curriculum during my internship, that will include essays on every book of the bible, exegetical papers, as well as book reports from various authors.
